## PROCEEDINGS

CHAIRMAN KICKLER: I'll call the meeting to order. I want to welcome everybody to the Clean Water Management Trust Fund Board of Trustees meeting on March the 2nd. The meeting is being physically held at the Bodie Island Conference Room in the Green Square Building in Raleigh. Many of our trustees are calling in via conference call, but this our full —our first full Board meeting of 2016.

I'll now take -- Well, before I take the roll call, Deputy Secretary Kevin Cherry is in the room here with us today, and I'll let him say a few words.

DR. CHERRY: Thank you. I am Kevin
Cherry. I'm the deputy secretary of the Department
of Natural and Cultural Resources. And we are
delighted to have the Division of Land and Water
Stewardship to be with our department now. As I was
walking over here, I try to walk through one of our
museums instead of on the sidewalks as much as
possible. So as I was walking through, I heard off
in the distance this little boy say, "Oh, my gosh.
How" -- (coughing on phone.) I bet a lot of other
cabinet level departments got that kind of praise
this morning.

So -- But we get that kind of praise because of the people that we work with. And I know that the Trustees know this, but I want to remind everybody what a great job all of our employees do that work for the Natural Heritage Program, and the Clean Water Management Trust Fund Program. They do extraordinary work, and it's the kind of work that will last for generations, and we all appreciate it.

I can tell you that every time our department has sent over a request lately for information -- and we try not to bother them too much with those kind of requests, but we get asked to share information, so we have to get it from the people who know. So we ask the staff, and it's a turnaround almost immediately. And that is very appreciative, and I appreciate it greatly.

So I just want to thank the staff publicly, remind the Trustees of the important work that they do, and assure that we really do value their work, and we are happy to have them in our department.

But these are issues on our 17 consent agenda. And, Greer, it would be acceptable 18 if you chose to proceed this way to entertain a 19 motion to adopt the consent agreement if you chose to proceed in that fashion. 20 21 MS. CAWOOD: We can do that, and then have discussion following the motion. So do we have 22 23 a motion to approve these, and then we'll be able to have discussion after that? 24 25 MR. MARTIN: So moved. Motion passes. 6 And I will pass the gavel back to our chairperson. 7 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Thank you, Greer. 8 Thank you, Greer. Now we move on to the next item on 9 the agenda, which is the legal update. As you know, 10 Clean Water Management Trust Fund has been 11 transferred from what was formally known as DENR, 12 what is now known as DEQ, to the newly named 13 Department of Natural and Cultural Resources. So for 14 the legal update, I turn the time over to Mary 15 Lucasse. 16 MS. LUCASSE: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. 17 wanted to take this opportunity to inform the Board 18 Trustees, as I've already told the Chairman and 19 staff, that the Department of Justice, of whom -- of which I'm an employee, does not have a contract to 20 21 provide legal services to the Department of Natural 22 and Cultural Resources. So at this point, with the 23 transfer of Clean Water Management Trust Fund to that 24 department, Sean and I, and, in fact, the entire 25 Department of Justice will not be representing Clean

Water Management Trust Fund following this meeting.

Now, there are -- there are ways that the Department of Cultural and Natural Resources can contract with the Department of Justice to get legal services for the Clean Water Management Trust Fund.

And I've already provided the name of our deputy -- the chief deputy at the Attorney General's Office,

Grayson Kelley, to staff and Kevin Howell, the general counsel at the Department of Natural and

Cultural Resources. So this is just one of those things that happens when there are the changes in where Clean Water is positioned.

And at this point I just wanted to ask if you had any questions about that, and also to express mine and Sean's appreciation for the opportunity to have worked with Clean Water Management Trust Fund over the years. We've really appreciated the work that's been done by the Board members, and we have enjoyed all the different tasks that we've gotten pulled into as staff, and always learned something from staff. And I really appreciated the work everybody has done.

Now, just in closing, I will say I do have permission from my supervisors to complete the Coffey case. We're still working very hard to get opposing

counsel to finish up the settlement agreement and the dismissal with prejudice in Caldwell County. And at the last administrative calendar our case was called, and the judge was given an update on why it was taking so long, and was asked to dismiss the case as I understand it. And the judge in his infinite wisdom allowed the plaintiff's attorney 45 more days from that point to finish up the work he needed to do.

And that 45 days will be over March 4, at which point if the settlement has not been signed, and the dismissal has not been filed, the defendants will move forward with a motion to compel settlement. So Sean and I will be in a position to finish that up for you. And we've gotten permission from our supervisors to do that, because it's -- it should be done. It's almost done. It will be done. And I just don't want to pass it off in that -- in that format.

I also have a little project I'm working on with Larry. If you recall at our last meeting, the Board had approved the County of Brunswick and the City of Northwest transfer of part of the sewage system, and we are putting together an MOU. We've gotten that in draft form, and are just waiting to

get that finalized.

So aside from those two little things, which I'll finish up, and Sean and I will finish up, this will be our last meeting working with you until such time as a contract for legal services is negotiated, which is something that can happen.

That's my report, Mr. Chairman.

CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. Thank you.

Thank you, Mary. We'll move on to the next item on the agenda, which is the executive director's update.

I'd like to recognize Executive Director Bryan

Gossage, who is joining us via conference call right now. So, Bryan, I turn the time over to you.

MR. GOSSAGE: Good morning. Thank you,
Mr. Chairman. I have a laundry list of items. First
I did want to note to the rest of the Trustees -Chairman Kickler is aware of this already -- but I
have been ordered into active duty, and so I will be
out of office for many weeks to come. But I am
calling in today from -- Montgomery, Alabama is where
I am this morning.

I want to thank the Trustees for spending a little bit of their time out of their normal busy lives to be with us this morning. I also want to thank Mary and Sean for the great work that they have

done. The Coffey case is a great example of their patience and dedication and hard work. So thank you very much.

I also want to thank Tom Massie. He's not on the call this morning, but his last day with the Trust Fund after 18 years of service is now retired. And that was effective February 29th. So he is no longer with the Trust Fund. And Will Summer is working — he and Nancy are working on interviews for two new field reps. So you'll be — probably introduced to two new field reps at the June 7th meeting.

The June 7th meeting, I'll just segue right into that. We are looking at holding that outside of Raleigh, and we're looking at Charlotte, North Carolina for the location for that meeting. So for those of you, the Trustees with connections to Charlotte, you might be hearing from Hailey, who is working on the logistics of finding a good meeting location, and you'll be hearing from her. And the rest of the Trustees will be hearing from her in the weeks ahead about where exactly that meeting will take place.

As a reminder to all the Trustees about your State Economics Interest. And I believe that's

an annual form that you have to fill out. And that is due on April the 15th. And I believe -- Oh, and later in this call Will Summer will be presenting some remarks on the contracts that were -- the grants that were allocated at your November funding meeting.

Mr. Chairman, that concludes my remarks.

CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. Thank you,
Bryan. Now we'll move on to old business. And old
business 1 is 2015-010, Catawba Lands Conservancy,
the Holly Tract. Essentially, we've asked for a
revised scope of work. And I'll turn the time over
to Nancy to provide a brief summary at their request.

MS. GUTHRIE: Okay. Thank you, Mr.

Chairman. All three of the old business items today concern a change in scope for the project. And I want to give you just a little context to why you are seeing these on the agenda today. Clean Water does have a policy that helps us determine at which level decisions are made, if it's a staff level, Chairman level, or a Board level. And the considerations include a reduction in the number of acres in a project. An increase in the cost per acre is another consideration. And if the reduction in acres or the increase in cost per acre is greater than 25 percent, then it is a Board decision. And so that's why

you're seeing these three today.

You have not seen these before, I don't believe. And I think that that might be a reflection that the market is getting a little bit stronger, that between award or between application and contract, folks are going back and having appraisals updated, realizing that land prices are increasing a little bit out there. And so the owners are feeling maybe a little bit more confident to ask for a higher price per acre, or they may at this point want to hold onto a portion of their property for other uses in the future.

So I do want to just remind everyone too that Clean Water has another policy that if the -Well, and this concerns the projects today, because a number of them haven't increased in the cost per acre, that Clean Water does have a policy that requires all land acquisition projects be -- there be an appraisal, at least one appraisal, and two appraisals if the cost is greater than \$500,000.

Those appraisals must be approved by State Property Office so that Clean Water is never paying above the market. And so we do rely very heavily on State Property Office to keep Clean Water well within the market range of a price so that Clean Water is not

driving conservation values in the market.

So with that little introduction to all three of these projects, I'll go specifically into the first one with the Catawba Lands Conservancy. I think the easiest way to approach this is if you will look at the map in your Board packet. That's 2015-010 with "Original Project" written on the top. All of the project outlined in red and shaded blue or yellow was part of the project. And Catawba Lands Conservancy was to purchase that area and record restrictive covenants on the property. Restrictive covenants are our usual instrument for properties that are going to be part of the Carolina Thread Trail. And the Carolina Thread Trail is a large effort in the Charlotte-Mecklenburg area, and the surrounding counties for a greenway.

And so at this point that project, that overall initiative, they're buying pieces of property, trying to get corridors put together so that trails can be built. So that was the original proposal for this project.

Then if you'll look at the next map, which is the proposed revision for this project, the gray areas are now proposed to be excluded from the project. Those areas would be retained by the owner,

1 which is the U.S. Whitewater Center, which operates 2 in some active recreation just south of this entire 3 area. But they would like to retain that area that 4 is in gray, just remove that from the project. 5 yellow area would be donated to -- Excuse me. yellow area would be a donated easement held and 6 7 monitored by Carolina Lands Conservancy. 8 MR. BRAGG: Catawba? 9 Catawba, thank you. MS. GUTHRIE: 10 The dark green area would be purchased by 11 Catawba Lands Conservancy with restrictive covenants 12 recorded on it. And the light green area would be 13 covered by conservation easements purchased and held 14 by Catawba Lands Conservancy. It's possible that a 15 smaller area of the light green would be purchased 16 and be simple. But the most recent agreement and 17 request is for the light green area to be a 18 conservation easement purchase, again held and 19 monitored by Catawba Lands Conservancy. And I will 20 stop and make sure people understand the project and 21 the changes at this point.

Now we move on to old business 2, which is 2014-018, 6 7 the City of Creedmoor, Lake Rogers Tract, Ledge Creek. And so for this, I will also turn the time 8 9 over to Nancy for a brief summary. 10 MS. GUTHRIE: Thank you. On this project, 11 if you compare the two maps that were included in a 12 Board packet, you'll see that in the original 13 project, more of the uplands were to be purchased by 14 the city, and they were considering public space use 15 with that area. The plans had not been finalized, 16 but in general they were looking for some passive 17 recreation, possibly even an amphitheater gathering 18 area. 19 But in working with the landowner since this project was awarded, the owner would now like to 20 21 retain a lot or a good portion of the uplands without 22 any restrictions. And the city would be able to 23 purchase the lake shore and the riparian buffers 24 along the streams that are on the property. And the

city would be able to use some of that area for a

25

construction of a greenway. So there would have -there would still be some public access and use of
the property through the greenway, but it would be
less than originally proposed when you all saw this
project presented to you.

And I have included in the Board packet some of the details of the cost, and then the numbers of acres. And again, I will just stop and see if you have any questions at this point.

CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Any questions for Nancy?

MR. MARTIN: Yeah. This is Trustee

Martin. I was just -- So you said that they are

still -- there's still the possibility of a greenway

route. Would that really be the only public access

that we would be able to sort of guarantee for this

property, or is there -- I guess I'm a little

concerned about just, you know, ultimately what kind

of access the public is going to have to this -- to

this area.

MS. GUTHRIE: At this point, there is a greenway route, proposed route shown on the map. And that would be the only public use of the property. I think the lakeshore, which is protecting the water there -- I have not been on the property, but I

1 expect that that would be too low -- too many streams 2 there to really have any kind of organized 3 recreational activities for the public. 4 MR. MARTIN: Thank you. 5 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Are there any other 6 questions for Nancy? 7 (No response.) 8 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. 9 MR. BRAGG: This is Trustee Bragg. As I 10 understand Lake Rogers, it's one of the drinking 11 sources for the Town of Creedmoor. And the other, 12 though, it's a very fine fishing lake that's restricted to electric motors as I recall. So it's 13 14 used by the public is my point. 15 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. 16 MS. GUTHRIE: Okay. It has -- This is 17 I know it has been used in the past as Nancy again. 18 drinking supply. I believe some infrastructure is 19 still there as a potential emergency in the future. 20 So yes, it is -- it is a high quality as far as I 21 know. 22 And this is Will Summer. MR. SUMMER: 23 I'll just add that there is a park with lake access 24 just across the lake from this. So you're correct, 25 Trustee Bragg. They do -- This lake is used for

That agenda item, old business 3 is a Division of Parks & Recreation request for Warwick Mill Bay. And so again, I turn the time over to Nancy for a brief summary.

MS. GUTHRIE: Okay. Thank you, Mr.

Chairman. There is just one map included for this project. And again, I think it's easiest to talk from the maps so that you can follow the changes there. The original proposal was to purchase the 976.5-acre area as well as the 350-acre area for just over 1,300 acres total in the project.

The landowner would now like to retain the 350 acres in the southern part of the project, and also to be able to build two small ponds that are in that 350-acre area. He would like to fill those ponds from September to January, which is duck season, using water from the bay. And that would be

the restriction of using that, any water or changing the level of the Mill Pond. No irrigation throughout any of the year. No other changes in the water level in the bay.

The Department of Parks & Recreation does think this is still a viable project, and a resource to be brought into the State Park System as a state natural area. The plans did not include opening this area to the public in an active way because of the sensitivity of the wading and nesting birds that are in this particular mill -- excuse me, in this particular bay.

Also on the map there's a shaded area that is the -- labeled as the "Bird Area." Audubon North Carolina has looked at this. This is a unique area for North Carolina. The Audubon of North Carolina does not think that the changes and having the owner retain a portion of the tract including just that bottom corner of the colony would impact the colony negatively. So all parties do feel that this is still a significant resource to bring into the State Park System.

So again, there are details that there are fewer acres being purchased. Clean Water's contribution would also decrease. And State Parks

1 would like to go ahead and move to closing on this if 2 you all approve the changes this morning, again 3 because of the landowner timing. 4 Thank you, Nancy. CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Are 5 there any questions regarding this agenda item? MR. MARTIN: This is Trustee Martin. 6 Ι 7 just have one question. Since the 350 acres included 8 uplands, and the 975, I mean, this looks like a 9 Carolina bay, I'm assuming that it's probably mostly 10 wet. 11 MS. GUTHRIE: Yes. 12 Does this reduction in funds MR. MARTIN: 13 sort of account for the difference in potential value 14 per acre? Before we 7 adjourn, Will is going to give us a brief update on 8 the status of the awards, where -- at what stage they 9 are at, a cursory look at that. So, Will, I'll turn 10 the time over to you. 11 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. MR. SUMMER: 12 Good morning, Trustees. As Dr. Cherry said 13 yesterday, once the -- once the Board has made a decision, the work is really just getting started. 14 15 And with that, I'd love to update you guys on where we -- where the staff has been with the 2015 16 17 applications. And I will start with acquisition. 18 Of the 35 projects that have been awarded, 19 all but three contracts have been drafted and sent 20 out. And I know Nancy would like me to point out 21 that of those three, one is the one -- one of the ones you have decided on today, so it was waiting on 22 23 decision. And the other two have been very recently 24 provisionally funded, which means the funds just came

in, and she's just getting that process started.

25

everything else has been drafted and sent out to our applicants. And of that, 16 have already been signed, returned, and executed, and encumbered for a total of 7.7 million already encumbered.

To recap, just over 16 million has been awarded to date in acquisition projects. And since the November meeting, 1.7 million has been awarded to three additional projects from the provisional list. After that, we have already a little over 740,000 accumulated to go towards the next project on the list, which is the Conservation Fund Smith Creek Project, which will still lack about 460,000 before it is completely funded. But there are still several more months of revenue to come back in.

On restoration, 15 out of 15 contracts have been drafted and sent out. None have been executed to date. And this totals about 4.1 million that has been awarded to date. In the restoration program, no additional contracts have been awarded since

September -- I mean, since November. And we're very close to completing the funds for the next project.

We have a little over 207,000 accumulated towards the Lake Waccamaw hydrilla project, which will then only lack about 12,000 from being funded. And we expect that to happen when the next month's license revenue

comes in.

Innovative stormwater, as you may recall from the meeting, four of four have been funded, and contracts are drafted and sent out. Because we funded all of the applications we had, there are none that will be added as provisional funds come back in. So that 5 percent worth of provisional funds will be divided up amongst acquisition and restoration projects.

So in summary for the 2015s, 54
applications have been funded for a total of \$20.9
million awarded to date. An addition 948,000 is
ready to be awarded towards the next provisional
projects as more revenue comes in. And since
November 20th, 2.4 million in additional revenue and
unencumbered grants has come in. So since your last
meeting, we've moved quite a ways down the list, and
have a few more months to continue to do more.

I would -- If I could take a moment just to give you a real brief update on the 2016s?

CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Yeah.

MR. SUMMER: Absolutely. Thank you. So we have 128 applications that we just received for our 2016 grant cycle, which -- 81.4 million in total requests. This is 90 acquisition projects for 64.9

1 million; 26 restoration projects for 14.2 million; 2 eight innovative stormwater projects for just over 2 3 million; and four planning applications for 193,000. 4 And we've got applications from 43 counties and 64 5 unique applicants. So as Mr. Holman said, we've got 6 our work cut out for us for this cycle, but we look 7 forward to getting into it. 8 And with that, that will conclude my 9 Thank you, Mr. Chairman. report. 10 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: All right. Do the 11 Trustees have any questions for Will regarding this 12 report? 13 (No response.) 14 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. Thank you, Will. 15 We thought it would be a good idea to give the 16 Trustees a brief update on the status of the awards. 17 Before we adjourn, I want to ask the Trustees if they 18 have any comments at this time. 19 Yes, sir, Mr. Chairman. MR. BRAGG: 20 This is Frank Bragg. I have two quick comments. 21 number one, I wish to say how much I appreciate Mary Lucasse's keeping us legal and ethical and squeaky 22 23 clean in both areas. But, you know, I guess one of the things that's kind of -- that Nancy alluded to, that, you know, we're seeing some, you know, uptick of land prices and things of that nature. Maybe people are reconsidering. I think it would probably behoove us to kind of go back and -- from the -- possibly from the Administrative Committee look at some of these criteria that we set as far as when things bump up and whatnot.

Maybe we should just re-look at this and see if we need to go back and revisit that. I mean, I guess what I'm -- I'm beginning to think, you know -- And again, without having thought about it for a long time, you know, when would we -- when would we state that a project is so different from our original objective that it's -- that maybe we would not have funded it? And so I think we just need to kind of go back and see this trend that's developing. Maybe we need to go back and look at that. So I would just -- I would just offer that as some thoughts I've had.

1 MS. CAWOOD: Mr. Chairman, if you'd like 2 for the Administrative -- This is Greer Cawood. 3 you'd like for the Administrative Committee to take 4 that on, we would be happy to. 5 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. Thank you. 6 my capacity as Chair, I will refer to the 7 Administrative Committee to revisit this, when should 8 it be bumped up and to investigate, to explore the 9 pricing of land or the re-pricing of land, and to re-10 examine that criteria. So I'll refer that to the 11 Administrative Committee. I know there are some 12 other things in the queue for the Administrative 13 Committee. Would that be possible to have an update 14 or a report for the June meeting? 15 MS. CAWOOD: I was thinking that we -- We 16 will try our best, Mr. Chairman. I know that we will 17 meet between now and the June meeting, so we'll make 18 our best efforts towards that. 19 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Okay. Thank you. I've 20 just been reminded that the -- the -- I forgot the U.S. representative primary is June 7th. And that's 21 22 due to redistricting, correct? I think. 23 MR. SUMMER: I believe so, yes. 24 MS. KUMOR: Yeah. 25 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: We believe so. So at

1 this point, I mean, the meeting shouldn't take a long 2 time for June. And it won't take the entire time the 3 polls are open. But that's something we could revisit in subsequent days, or I and the executive 4 5 director can think about in subsequent days. 6 Any other comments from the Trustees? 7 (No response.) 8 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: Well, I also want to 9 plant a seed in the Trustees' head maybe. I would 10 like for us to start discussing at our next meeting 11 whether we should have an additional meeting, an 12 awards meeting, and maybe one committee -- We can --13 Again, we can start -- start the discussion. But I 14 was wondering whether we needed some more in-depth 15 discussion and time for questions during our award 16 meetings for stream restoration, innovative 17 stormwater, and maybe a separate meeting for the 18 acquisition projects. Again, I'd just like to start 19 the discussion on June 7th. But I just wanted to 20 plant the seed, so to speak, so people can be mulling 21 over that. 22 Are there any other comments from the 23 Trustees? 24 (No response.) 25 CHAIRMAN KICKLER: All right.
