CWMTF - Planning Grant PROGRAM CHANGES 2019

The CWMTF application evaluation system (previously known as the Scoring Criteria) is now called the **Application Rating System.**

Updates for the 2019 Cycle

The Application Rating System for planning projects has been modified for the 2019 cycle to reflect the CWMTF Board of Trustee's interest in **promoting applications that will protect drinking water supplies and applications that will protect key fishery nursery areas**.

Five sets of changes to the ranking system, all within the **Resource Significance** category:

- Planning applications will receive points for Resource Significance only for water bodies within the proposed project area or less than one (1) river mile downstream from the project site. This allows the fund to more closely target significant resources as compared to previous years when downstream classifications as far as 5 miles may have been considered.
- 2) Water Supply II (WS-II) has been moved up to the 17-point category. This is the same point value as for Water Supply I (WS-I) and Water Supply Critical Area (WS-CA) watersheds.

The point value for **Water Supply III and IV** watersheds have also been raised from last year's values while the point category. Water Supply V watershed remains unchanged.

- 3) **Primary Nursery Areas** (including **Inland Primary Nursery Areas**), as designated by State agencies, now earns 14-points, an increase in score from last year.
- 4) **Surface Drinking Water Susceptibility Rating of "Higher"** will now receive 11 points, **a reduction in score** from last year. This is due to the broad and widespread distribution of these areas.
- 5) Due to the lack of a clear definition and without a State agency mediator for the category of **"Other impaired waters but not on the 303(d) list"** this designation **will no longer qualify an application for points** as of the 2019 cycle.
